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School Uniform Information for Parents, carers and families

This information applies to all pupils in the school including EYFS and should be read in conjunction with the Whitehall Park School Uniform Policy.

School Uniform and Equipment

At Whitehall Park School we pride ourselves on our 'Look Smart, Think Smart' philosophy and ask parents to support us in instilling these ethos in the children.

Our school uniform policy (separate document available upon request) is based on the notion that a school uniform promotes a sense of pride in the school, looks smart and is practical and makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance. Uniform should be worn with pride for the reason that everyone has the same smart appearance and celebrates belonging to the same school. The clothes the children wear should enhance that professional appearance.

In 2015, we have made some amendments to the colours of our uniform, as well as appointing a new supplier for our Whitehall park specific items, such as blazers, ties and school bags. We ask parents to ensure that their children are provided with the items of compulsory uniform. Many of the other uniform items are available to purchase from our uniform supplier, but parents do have the choice of purchasing these from their own suppliers as well.

Children who joined our school in 2014 are permitted to wear items from the previous uniform until the child has grown out of the items. Once your child has grown out of the old uniform items, we would ask parents to begin to purchase uniform items that match our new colour schemes.

What do I need for my child?

There are particular items of uniform that we would encourage all children to wear so they feel a part of the Whitehall Park family. These items are compulsory to purchase from <http://www.uniform4kids.com/>

What items are compulsory?

Daily Uniform:

- Whitehall Park School Blazer
- White shirt (short sleeves are preferable for children in Reception – Year 2)
- Navy blue Jumper, cardigan or tank top with school logo
- Grey trousers or shorts for boys and skirts, trousers or pinafore for girls. In summer girls may also choose summer dresses in blue gingham.
- Whitehall Park School Tie
- Book bag and/or rucksack
- Black or navy school shoes

PE Kit:

- Navy blue Tracksuit top and bottoms
- Aertex Sports top – pale blue
- Navy shorts
- Blue sports socks
- Whitehall Park PE bag
- Black or navy sports shoes/trainers or plimsolls

To ensure that families and parents have the correct items, we have compiled a short list below highlighting which items their child should have:-

Keeping Equipment and Clothing Safe

Please ensure that all items of clothing, accessories and equipment are clearly labelled with large labels placed in the inner neck or inner rear hem of all items. Please do not place labels on the inside pockets of blazers - they need to be in a visible place for when blazers are hung up on coat hangers. Items do occasionally go missing at school and will often be found in the Lost Property box. We will only be able to help you find items if they are clearly labelled with your child's name in an obvious and easy to find place!

Blazers

Children will need their blazer in school every day. They will need to wear their blazer at the start of the school day and for formal occasions such as assembly. Children will be sent home wearing their blazer at the end of the day. During the day, especially when taking part in messy play, blazers will be taken off. Although they are machine washable, we will endeavour to help the children to keep them as clean as possible.

Outside learning

We will be outside a great deal of the time in all weather conditions, so it is important that your child is dressed appropriately each day. This should include outdoor coats and wellingtons, sun hats and sun cream. Please apply sun cream before the school day starts as we cannot do this at school.

PE Kits

PE kit should be available in school every day as PE is an integral part of the school day. It is best if the children leave their PE kit in school and we will send it home to be washed at the end of each week or earlier if necessary. PE will take place outdoor wherever possible, so children will need a tracksuit in cold weather.

Spare clothes

Spare clothes are very useful in school for Reception age children. Please bring a small bag with spare pants, socks and trousers/skirt in case of any accidents.

Hair, Jewellery and accessories



Long hair must be tied back. Girls may wear one pair of small gold or silver studs. These will need to be taken out or covered for PE, so it more convenient if they don't wear them at all. Children may wear a watch, but no other jewellery unless it is of specific religious significance. No nail varnish to be worn at school please.

Equipment

We encourage our children to take responsibility for themselves and as part of this ethos we ask that children begin to bring a small amount of equipment into school when they reach the end of the Reception year. Details will be provided then. Occasionally children will be asked to bring in things which are relevant to a school topic or activity, please make sure that all these items are carefully labelled.
