




Reception home learning due: 22.11.18

 <p>Can you draw and label the animals the Gruffalo's Child meets on her way to find the big bad mouse?</p>	<p>Can you draw and label different light sources we could use to make shadows? Remember the ones we talked about in class.</p> 	<p>It is suggested that children in Reception should read for a minimum of 15 minutes every day including Saturday and Sunday.</p>  <p>Can you ask your child: What happened so far? What might happen next? What is your favourite page in the book and why? <i>Remember your child's reading record should be in school every day.</i></p>	<p>The Gruffalo's Child gives the owl 6 sweets and the fox 3 sweets. How many sweets did she give altogether?</p> <p>Can you draw a picture to match the word problem?</p> <p>Don't forget plus + and equals =</p> <p>Here is an example of what it might look like:</p>
	<p>Phonics and Handwriting</p> <p>Every week in phonics we will learn new sounds. These may be phonemes. Practise your sounds at home. Your adult can google the 'Set 1' sounds we learn in 'Read Write Inc' or find them in your reading record.</p>		

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
