<p>Shakespeare: Macbeth</p> <p>Shakespeare's shortest tragedy holds attention through its rapid action, sinister atmosphere and convincing psychology. This is one of the most accessible of Shakespeare's plays and its plot can be easily translated into modern terms. It raises moral dilemmas and issues that provoke discussion. It is full of strong visual imagery and memorable language and is an excellent introduction to Shakespeare's writing.</p>  <p>In this topic, the overall aims of this teaching sequence are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To explore the themes of a Shakespeare tragedy.
